



Autumn Colours!



Autumn is fast approaching and soon the leaves on the trees will be turning beautiful shades of golds, reds and oranges. This is a great time of year to get outside and explore the countryside and we have a fun activity for you to do whilst you're out!

You wil need:

- · Leaf template
- Recycled cereal packet
- Double-sided sticky tape

Stick the leaf template opposite onto your cereal packet and cut around the shape. Now add strips of double-sided sticky tape to your leaf shape. Don't peel off the top layer of the tape until you are ready to start sticking.

Head out into your local park or woods and see how many different colours and shades of leaf you can find! Rip small pieces off each different coloured leaf and stick it onto your shape. Try to use leaves that have already fallen off a tree if possible but don't forget all the green shades on the evergreens too!
